Every three months, the performance of the Twinning project is evaluated through the quarterly meetings of the Steering Committee. The first of these meetings were held in the beginning of September. We have chosen to use this Newsletter to give the floor to the two project leaders by quoting them from what was actually said during the meeting.

"The Twinning Project is addressing the Israeli statistical system on different levels; the challenges to official statistics are tackled on a global level and the Twinning is making CBS more responsive and adept to answer them. The atmosphere created in CBS is of productive development and of commitment to results within a tight time schedule.

During the Twinning project, the National Statistics System (NSS) is being defined. The partners of the NSS, mainly within the public sector, have already expressed their support and willingness to cooperate. The Bank of Israel, one of the main partners, has been directly involved in the project especially in the National Accounts component. The RTA is taking part in monthly status meetings held in the Information and Statistics Department of the Bank of Israel. In addition, the Bank of Israel, on their own request and expense, hosted and participated in activities, including a study visit of the Dissemination and Website component to Statistics Denmark.

On the individual level, the European-Danish experts, our 'twins', are true professionals and easy going people – these are the most important ingredients for such an endeavor. It is very functional for the establishment of demanding routines and for constructive interactions with the project partners.

We are very satisfied with the Twinning so far. It contributes significantly to the routines and the working to development pace of official statistics. Addressing current and future challenges in official statistics will have to be done on more than a single country level, so 'multi-sibling' projects will be more than welcome in the future."
